Report for Decision: PCC 2020 / 010

Title: Police Property Act Fund – High Sheriff grant awards 2019/20

Executive Summary:

The Police Property Act Fund is created from the proceeds of sale of goods recovered by the police that cannot be returned to their original owner. In accordance with the Police Property Act Fund (PPAF) Regulations (1997) all awards from the fund must be for charitable purposes.

Earlier this year the PCC and Chief Constable jointly agreed to give £25,000 to each of the three county based High Sheriffs to award to local charities and/or community groups that support delivery of the PCC's Police and Crime Plan.

The three High Sheriffs submitted their individual proposals to the PCC and, following approval, cash payments to the individual organisations were made from this office. Attached at Appendix 1 is a list of grant allocations from each of the three High Sheriffs. In total, 11 separate awards have been made, totalling £75,000.

Recommendation:

The PCC is asked to APPROVE that the High Sheriff grant awards, as set out in Appendix 1, be funded from the Police Property Act Fund in 2019/20

1 Introduction and background

- 1.1 The Police (Property) Act 1997 is a fund whereby allocations are received from the sale of recovered stolen goods or property. If the owners of the property are not traceable then the goods are sold at auction. The monies from the sales of the goods are then redistributed by way of grants or donations for charitable purposes that support and complement local policing and crime reduction priorities.
- 1.2 Approximately £350,000 was available for distribution during 2019/20, of which £273,533 has been awarded to 69 separate organisations through two public bidding rounds.
- 1.3 £75,000 has been given to the three county based High Sherriff's for them to allocate to local good causes who help the police reduce crime and disorder.
- 1.4 Under the Scheme of Governance, Financial Regulations provide for the PCC and Chief Constable to jointly determine the payments to be made in accordance with the Regulations.

2 Issues for consideration

- 2.1 The three High Sheriffs have nominated their preferred charities, the amounts to be awarded and explained, in each case, how these organisations will help the PCC to deliver his Police and Crime Plan aims and objectives.
- 2.2 A full list of awards is provided in Appendix 1. Eleven separate charities are being supported with individual grants ranging from £5,000 to £12,500

3 Financial comments

3.1 £75,000 has been allocated through the High Sheriff grant award process.

4 Legal comments

4.1 Under regulation 6(4)(c) of the Police (Property) Regulations 1997 the payment must be made for "charitable purposes". By virtue of the Charities Act 2011 a charitable purposes is one that falls under section 3(1) of the Act and is for the public benefit, which means it does not necessarily have to be a registered charity.
