I write in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request submitted on 11 June 2025

The Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) for Thames Valley has now considered this request, which for clarity, has been repeated below:

<b>1. What is the name of any current provision of domestic abuse perpetrator services you have commissioned?</b>	DRIVE is a high-harm domestic abuse perpetrator programme that is delivered across the Thames Valley.  COBI Compulsive and Obsessive Behaviour Intervention (COBI) aims to tackle stalking, reduce re-offending and increase public safety. The programme is delivered across Thames Valley.
<b>2. Which service(s) run these?</b>	DRIVE is delivered by Cranstoun, supported by Thames Valley Police, and DRIVE Central (consortium between Respect, SafeLives and Social Finance).  COBI is delivered by Interventions Alliance, supported by Probation and Thames Valley Police.
<b>3. What is the length of these contracts?</b>	Both these services are funded through the Home Office, Domestic Abuse

<p><b>4. What is the total amount awarded to these programmes?</b></p>	<p>Perpetrator Intervention Fund (DAPIF). The current grant runs up until 31<sup>st</sup> March 2026.</p> <p>DRIVE is enabled through a £998,346 grant</p> <p>COBI is enabled through a £452,172 grant</p>
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
